Moral: Don't be a fool.

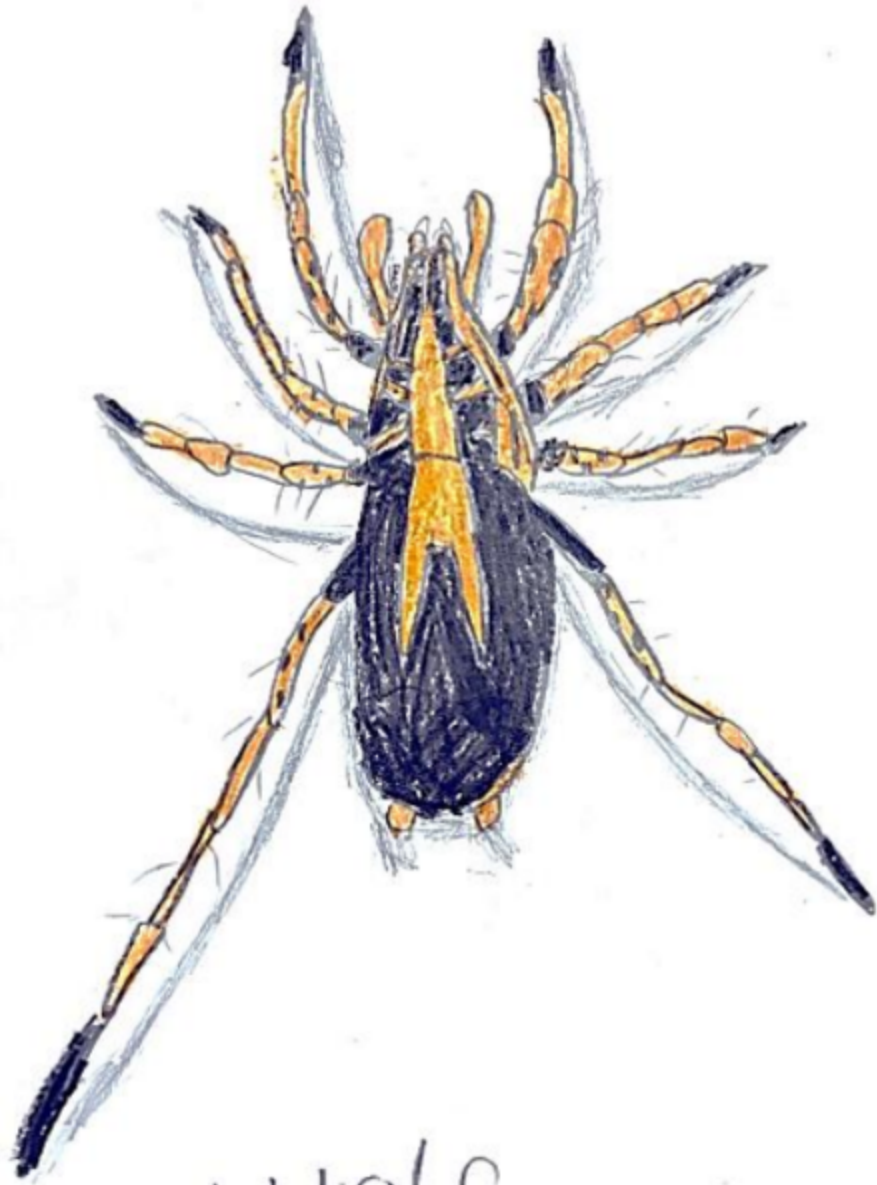
